A Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the policy board of an organization created and designated to carry out the metropolitan transportation planning process. MPOs are required to represent localities in all urbanized areas (UZAs) with populations over 50,000, as determined by the U.S. Census. MPOs are designated by agreement between the governor and local governments that together represent at least 75 percent of the affected population (including the largest incorporated city, based on population) or in accordance with procedures established by applicable state or local law. When submitting a transportation improvement program to the state for inclusion in the statewide program, MPOs self-certify that they have met all federal requirements.

	Item Summary	RGVMPO Staff has created an interactive ArcGIS Dashboard illustrating 202 Crash Data for Starr, Hidalgo, and Cameron counties.				
	Background	Each year, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) releases Traffic Crash Data updates onto their Crash Records Information System (C.R.I.S portal. Using 2022 Crash Data from the most recent update, RGVMPO states that created a user-friendly, interactive Dashboard using ArcGIS. This dashboard displays a Map which outlines the Metropolitan Area Boundar (MAB) and within it the crashes that happened in the region. The Dashboard can compute Crash Data statistics such as Total Crashes, Number of Deaths Number of Crashes per County, and the Vehicle Type of Crash. Users of this Dashboard are also able to filter Crash Data results by City and look uspecific places or addresses on the map. The 2022 Crash Data Dashboard on the RGVMPO Website; TAC and Policy Board members are encouraged to utilize this Dashboard at their leisure and share it with their organizations.
