PROGRAMMING FY2023-2024 TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES SET-ASIDE (TASA) FUNDS TO APPROVED PROJECTS

WHEREAS, the Rio Grande Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization (RGVMPO) received an apportionment of federal TASA funds for FY2023-2024; and

WHEREAS, the RGVMPO is the designated agency for programming apportioned TASA funds in the Transportation Management Area(s); and

WHEREAS, a competitive process was developed and approved by the RGVMPO Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC), Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and the Transportation Policy Board (TPB); and
