Meeting of the Rio Grande Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) Meeting

I. Welcome / Introductions

Andrew A. Canon, RGVMPO Executive Director welcome individuals to the initial Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee of the (RGV-MPO) for FY2020. BPAC meeting was held at the RGVMPO conference room located in Weslaco, Texas and called to order 11:00AM. Those in attendance were informed that although a Chairman and Vice Chairman have not been voted on, agenda items would be covered for discussion purposes only, until those items are covered later throughout the meeting. BPAC members will be discussing various items Transportation Alternative Set Aside (TASA) Funding; and what is best for the region as a whole and making recommendations to TAC and Policy Committees. Attendees were informed that BPAC was established at the request of TxDOT and was created through the restructuring of RGVMPO's Bicycle Pedestrian Task Force (Bike/Ped,) which is comprised of citizens and advocates. Introductions were then made by all those in attendance.

Discussion was held on what Day, Time, and Location to hold the BPAC Meetings. Andrew A. Canon suggested keeping meetings on the same day and time throughout the year to better facilitate BPAC members' participation. Michael McNew recommended for a one-year membership by BPAC Members. BPAC members present recommended to add and invite ISD Schools representatives to BPAC committee membership, as well as; the Metros Transit providers (SPI, Valley Metro and McAllen Metro).

Staff will invite BPAC members to participate in an upcoming meeting with Alliance, time and date still pending, staff will be sending out a calendar invite once meeting is set.

B. Discussion of Bylaws

Michael McNew discussed with BPAC members present and recommendations were as follows: 1) BPAC Meetings will be held on the 1st Wednesday of each month, at 11AM at the RGVMPO Conference area located at 510 South Pleasantview Drive – Weslaco. 2) BPAC Membership will be for (1) one year; 3) ISD Schools and Metros Providers will be invited to participate as members; 4) Add two representatives for Parks, Trails, and Greenland. (1) Federal and (1) State 5) Update Cities as per MAB. Michael McNew gave the members an opportunity to review the bylaws and noted if any changes needed to be address it will be considered in the following meeting.

No further discussion took place on this item, BPAC members acknowledged report and proceeded to the next item on the agenda.

C. Discussion on Nominations and Appointments

Andrew Canon, Executive Director recommended having a representative from Hidalgo and Cameron County. Mr. Canon recommended Rose Gowen, (City Commissioner) from Brownsville for Chair and Eudy Carrillo recommended Michael McNew for Vice Chair, mentioned he is very active in the community and involved in Run, Ride, Share program and volunteering for bike rodeos with the Weslaco bikearoos.

No further discussion took place on this item, and it was the consensus of BPAC members present to nominated Rose M. Z. Gowen as Chairwoman and Michael McNew as Vice Chairman.

D. Discussion on Revised TASA Application, Scoring Criteria, and Timeline

Rudy Zamora provided the updated TASA Application and Scoring criteria for the upcoming FY2021-2022 Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside Program (TASA) Call for Projects for BPAC Members review and recommendations. Staff will be seeking guidance and insight into the TASA Application, scoring criteria and timeline. Mr. Zamora noted that the TASA Application and Project Scoring Criteria contain revisions in red-colored text for identifications. These documents, along with the Project Call Timeline will be presented to TAC and Policy Board members for their approval.

Luis Diaz, Asst. RGVMPO Director provided a brief explanation on "UMAP Online" to BPAC members present, UMAP is an interactive map which can be accessed on RGVMPO website at www.rgvmpo.org. Staff is available for assistance in navigating or utilizing the UMAP online. Please noted that all Geographic Data will be considered for the TASA Applications and the only data sets available on UMAP are Regional Data Sets and not per individual entity. Luis Diaz concluded his presentation by mentioning that any discrepancies found in the data should be brought to RGVMPO staff attention so that those can be corrected.

After much discussion by BPAC members the following additions and recommendation to the TASA Application, Scoring Criteria and Timeline are highlighted in RED:

The learning hub will share valuable skills and public health information, while allowing the opportunity to meet and connect with other community members and various stakeholders from around the Rio Grande Valley. Texas A&M will continue to share information, ideas and strategies that will directly impact and improve the wellness of the Rio Grande Valley.

No discussion took place on this presentation, BPAC members present acknowledged presentation provided by both Ms. Castillo and Mr. Miller and proceeded to the next item on the agenda.

F. Discussion on Bicycle and Pedestrian Counting Workshop

Crystal Gonzalez, invited BPAC members present to the upcoming "Bicyclist and Pedestrian Count Data Workshop" where TxDOT and TTI will be conducting full-day training/workshops that will provide a "deep dive" into three areas of bicyclist and pedestrian data as follows: 1) Collecting data using various types of automated counters; 2) Summarizing and visualizing data using the Texas Bike and Pedestrian Count Exchange; and 3) Using the count data to make biking and walking safer in Texas.

Project sponsors are encouraged to submit their proposals far enough in advance of the submission deadline to allow RGVMPO staff to review proposals for completeness.

All applicants will be allowed to summarize their project (for no longer than 3 minutes in length), in person, the day of the scoring process. Right-of-way (ROW) acquisition is not eligible for TAP fund reimbursement, therefore, ROW acquisition is for informational purposes only. For sake of fairness and efficiency, all geographic data must be obtained from the RGVMPO GIS UMAP. If data is retrieved from other sources, please contact RGVMPO staff prior to submitting application. RGVMPO staff will confirm the accuracy of such data before acceptance. BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN Advisory Committee (BPAC) BYLAWS

REVISED APRIL 1, 2020

1. Purpose:

The purpose of the Rio Grande Valley Metropolitan Planning Organization's (RGVMPO) Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) is to support continuous and consistent infrastructure improvements to encourage cyclist and pedestrian activity and mobility. The RGVMPO-BPAC will provide technical and community input to the RGVMPO Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and the Transportation Policy Board (TPB) to help develop an efficient, sustainable and active transportation system that includes walking and bicycling facilities which support the livability and economic vibrancy of our communities and the safety and health of all members of the community.

The BPAC will:

- Consider all technical and public outreach issues related to bicycle and pedestrian mobility, including but not limited to urban design, construction standards, design standards, maintenance, access management, connectivity and safety.
- Participate in all regional transportation planning activities
- Recommend funding options and opportunities for bicycle and pedestrian related projects
- Participate in the promotion and implementation of the Regional Bike and Pedestrian Plans
- Recommend bicycle and pedestrian related planning studies to be conducted
- Promote and participate in the Annual Walk N Rolla events
- Communicate and educate cyclists, pedestrians, and motorists on each of their rights and responsibilities on the road
- Communicate with and educate the public and elected officials on the importance of bicycling and walking through a speaker's bureau as well as periodic articles and opinion pieces to appropriate agency and mass media.

2. Membership:

The RGVMPO-BPAC shall consist of a maximum of 21 voting members. These members define the "voting membership" and shall be appointed by their respective agencies or from a pool of applicants. All members must be active representatives of their respective agencies for the entire term of their service. Each member is entitled to one vote on each item submitted to a vote of the members.

 A total of eight (8) positions shall be open to appointed public agency staffs from any of the following:

oThe cities of Alamo, Alton, Bayview, Brownsville, Combes, Donna, Edcouch, Edinburg, Elsa, Granjeno, Harlingen, Hidalgo, Indian Lake, La Feria, La Joya, La Villa, Los Fresnos, Los Indios, McAllen, Mercedes, Mission, Palmvalley, Palmhurst, Palmview, Peñitas, Pharr, Port Isabel, Primera, Progreso, Progreso Lakes, Rancho Viejo, Rio Hondo, San Benito, San Juan, Santa Rosa, South Padre Island, Sullivan City, and Weslaco.

- o Hidalgo County Cameron County
- o Law Enforcement from any of the 38 cities mentioned above
- o Texas Department of Transportation Pharr District
- o Transit Providers: Metro McAllen, Valley Metro, SPI Metro

These members shall serve a two-year term to allow for other public agency staff from other entities a chance to participate. No entity shall have more than two positions on the BPAC. No member shall serve consecutive terms unless other entities do not wish to participate.

- One (1) position shall be open to a Chamber of Commerce / Economic Development organization at-large. These members will be selected by BPAC from a pool of applicants to serve based on their knowledge and experience in bicycling and pedestrian issues, respectively.
- Two (2) positions shall be open to individuals representing bicycle-oriented organizations atlarge. These members will be selected by BPAC from a pool of applicants to serve based on their knowledge and experience in bicycling and pedestrian issues, respectively.
- Two (2) positions shall be open to individuals representing pedestrian-oriented organizations at-large. These members will be selected by BPAC from a pool of applicants to serve based on their knowledge and experience in bicycling and pedestrian issues, respectively.
- A total of four (4) positions shall be open to other individuals representing organizations with an interest and an expertise in transportation and bicycle/pedestrian issues at-large. There shall not be more than one position awarded to one particular advocate category. BPAC shall select applicants from the following:
 - o Parks, Trails, and Greenways (1) State (1) Federal
 - Low-Income Advocates
 - Colonia Resident Advocates
 - Senior/ Elderly Advocates
 - Disabled Community
 - Community College/University
 - o Health/Fitness Community
- A total of four (4) positions shall be open to citizens to represent bicycle/pedestrian interest at-large. Citizens will be selected by BPAC from a pool of applicants to serve based on their knowledge and experience in bicycling and pedestrian issues, respectively.

These members shall be selected to serve a one-year or two-year term on the RGVMPO-BPAC because of their knowledge and experience in bicycling and pedestrian issues. Members wishing to serve after their term expires shall resubmit an application for selection. Applications for the atlarge positions will be mailed and/or emailed to the MPO's standard mailing/emailing list and will be available on the MPO's website. Applicants will be selected to serve on the BPAC by existing BPAC members based on knowledge and experience in bicycle and pedestrian issues.

All members will each nominate an alternate with full voting privileges in their absence to be approved by the RGVMPO-BPAC. Members shall reside within the RGVMPO's study area; with the exception of public agency staff who must represent an entity within the MPO study area.

3. Executive Committee

- The Chair shall be nominated and appointed by the RGVMPO-BPAC for a two-year term
- The Vice-Chair shall be nominated and appointed by the RGVMPO-BPAC for a two-year term and shall succeed the Chair in the event of a vacancy.
- The Secretary shall be nominated and appointed by the RGVMPO-BPAC for a two-year term and shall succeed the Vice-Chair in the event of a vacancy.

4. Maintaining Membership

- Voting members will be in ex-officio status after missing three (3) consecutive meetings. Members with ex-officio status wishing to regain voting privileges must attend (3) meetings before voting privileges are reinstated for the remainder of their term.
- Members wishing to resign their positions may be replaced by their alternative for the remainder of their term or allow for the BPAC to select from a pool of applicant for a new oneyear or two-year term.

5. Ex-Officio Membership:

• The RGVMPO's Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee may appoint ex-officio members as appropriate. The ex-officio members are not voting members but will receive all meeting materials and are encouraged to actively participate in all RGVMPO-BPAC discussions.

6. Procedures:

- The RGVMPO-BPAC shall meet monthly on the first Wednesday of the month with the exception
 of November and December, unless otherwise agreed upon by the RGVMPO-BPAC, but no less
 than quarterly.
- The RGVMPO as the lead agency will be responsible for coordinating the meeting's date, time and place, and will provide an agenda, packet, minutes and other attachments electronically to all the members of the RGVMPO-BPAC no later than a week before the meeting.
- Meeting minutes shall be made of each meeting and will be posted on the MPO's website following approval by the RGVMPO-BPAC.
- Each agenda will include a "Citizens' Input" item. Participation by interested citizens in attendance is encouraged.
 - A meeting quorum shall be defined as one-half plus one of the existing voting memberships.
 Vacancies shall not count against quorum. A quorum shall be present for all actions taken by the RGVMPO-BPAC. The quorum shall continue until adjournment regardless of the departure of any members.
- Bylaws can be expanded or modified as agreed upon by the RGVMPO-BPAC.
- Following Robert's Rules of Order, meetings will proceed in an orderly fashion, giving all members an opportunity to speak.
