Backgroun		According to the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), SEC. 11206, MPO's must use "not less than 2.5% of the amounts made available to the metropolitan planning organization under Section 104(d) of Title 23, United States Code" to carry out Complete Streets planning activities. Complete Streets Policies have shown to decrease the number of bicycle and pedestrian fatalities, increase the number of bicycle and pedestrian users on streets, and increase connectivity to key destinations for all users. Providing resources, such as a Complete Streets Handbook, can facilitate the adoption of Municipal Complete Streets Policies.
